Talking through the ideas presented in Sunday's message helps us apply God's word to our individual lives. These questions are designed to help you put His words into action in your life this week.

- As we looked at the end of Genesis 1 today, Joe described some
 of his thoughts about how we are "created in God's image". What
 is your initial reaction when you consider that? Have you ever
 spent any time thinking about what that truly implies? What
 characteristic can you now infer about your Creator?
- When you think about "living the dream" in Tulsa, before this morning's sermon, how would you have described that? Compare the dream of most Americans in 2011 to "living the dream" that God intends for us all. What dream are you choosing to pursue today?
- Why do you think God had you here today? What do you need to take away from this sermon? What steps do you need to take to apply this to your life today?

Some next steps: Here are some things you can do this week to dig deeper:

- Set aside some time this week to pray specifically that God would reveal Himself to you through scripture then carefully read Genesis chapter 2. Read it as if this is totally new information. Keep a blank sheet of paper with you and, as you read, ask yourself the question "What do these verses show me about who God is and what He is like?"
- Spend some of your time with God asking Him to show you when you have chosen to pursue a dream that was not His dream. Ask Him to give you clarity on how to order your life to follow His dream.
- Honestly evaluate the four key relationships discussed this morning: 1.) with God 2.) with family and friends 3.) with yourself and 4.) with the larger community. In which areas do you need to concentrate your energy to improve today?
